



National Lottery awards £10,000 to Normanby Local History Group to mark First World War Centenary




Normanby Local History Group members commence National Lottery project

Normanby Local History Group has received £10,000 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) for a project entitled "Gallantry in the face of the enemy, William Henry Short VC."

Made possible by National Lottery players through HLF's *First World War: then and now* programme, the project will focus on the life of local man William Henry Short who received the Victoria Cross for his actions on the 6th August 1916 in France.



Lonely Tower Film & Media, a production company based in the north east of England will be assisting the group to produce a film about their local hero.


The film will be shown locally and also made available to both libraries and schools for use as a resource.

Once completed the archive of information will also be shared with the local community through a series of talks and exhibitions.






LOTTERY FUNDED
